I have been in and around the island for 25 years, in the Sanctuary for 6 years.

I don't believe that there is sufficient data yet to determine if a lower speed would reduce the risk significantly; consider.

In 6 years I have never observed a citation being given for speed in the Sanctuary, does the data confirm this?

I have never observed a citation for roadside parking in the Sanctuary, although it is prohibited by Sanibel code.

I have never observed a citation for parking on the wrong side of the roadway (florida statute)

I have never observed a citation for unlicensed, unsafe off road machinery and vehicles on the roadway, without required safety lighting, turn signals, brake lights, manual signaling... these are all over the road out here routinely.

My concern is that another unenforced item, such as a reduction in speed, will lead to a false sense of safety that can only be reached with enforcement of the aforementioned items.

I am sure the required traffic study will highlight these contributing factors as significant or not significant, but I felt obligated to articulate them given the risk they present to those in the community.

- > We live on Wulfert Road and the problem isn't a 30 mph speed limit, it is the people driving at 50 mph or more. I would strongly support enforcement of the existing speed limits including the use of autonomous devices to record speed and license numbers.
