Hurricane Resilient Landscaping - Jenny Evans, Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation (SCCF)

Jenny Evans Adult Education Director from Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation (SCCF) provided a PowerPoint Presentation regarding landscape post hurricanes and storm surge water damage.

Natural Resources Liaison Rachel Rainbolt spoke to the city's Natural Resources Department providing guidance to residence regarding corrective and/or restorative trimming.

Public Comment:

Marianna Pardo - Inquired about an appropriate timeframe to begin trimming branches after seeing dead tissue. Ms. Evans responded to when and how to cut the tissue, the scratch test, and how to determine if the plant tissue is alive or dead.

Discussion ensued regarding seashore drop seed as well as similar saltmarsh vegetation and their sustainability post Hurrican Ian, Debbie, and Milton.

Ms. Evans discussed differences in landscaping plants and ground covers.

Public Comment:

Marianna Pardo - Inquired about the propagule for the red mangroves. Ms. Pardo spoke to her and her neighbors finding propagules far from their usual habitat. Ms. Evans responded to leaving the propagules and see what happens.

Discussion ensued regarding mangroves and the Mangrove Protection Act.

Ms. Evans provided information and websites on where you can find out more information on native plants and locations within Florida that the plants are native to.

Discussion ensued regarding recommendations on hardwood trees with a higher survival rate.

Natural Resource Joel Caouette requested Ms. Evans to touch on properties post storm with large vegetation that survived and the importance of saving the current vegetation before adding more to the landscaping.
