CITY OF SANIBEL RESOLUTION 25-015

A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL, FLORIDA, WAIVING THE APPLICATION FEE FOR VARIANCES SOUGHT TO AID IN RECOVERY FROM HURRICANE DAMAGE OR FOR RESILIENCY, SAME TO EXPIRE ON DECEMBER 31, 2025; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, on September 28, 2022, Hurricane Ian made landfall in Sanibel and other parts of Lee County as a Category 4 hurricane, causing catastrophic property damage and loss of life; and

WHEREAS, on September 26, 2022, in advance of Hurricane Ian's landfall, the City Council of the City of Sanibel passed Resolution No. 22-054, declaring a State of Local Emergency for a 7-day term, based upon the severe threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the City posed by Hurricane Ian, which State of Local Emergency has been extended continuously by Mayoral Proclamations since the initial issuance; and

WHEREAS, on September 24, 2024, in advance of Hurricane Helene's landfall, the City Council of the City of Sanibel enacted Mayoral Proclamation 24-40, declaring a State of Local Emergency for a 7-day term, based upon the severe threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the City posed by Hurricane Helene, which State of Local Emergency has been extended continuously by Mayoral Proclamations since the initial issuance; and

WHEREAS, on October 6, 2024, in advance of Hurricane Milton's landfall, the City Council of the City of Sanibel enacted Mayoral Proclamation 24-40, declaring a State of Local Emergency for a 7-day term, based upon the severe threat to the health, safety, and welfare of the City posed by Hurricane Helene, which State of Local Emergency has been extended continuously by Mayoral Proclamations since the initial issuance; and

WHEREAS, City Council desires to provide relief to property owners continuing to recover from the three hurricanes via a waiver of the variance application fee, said waiver to be applicable to hurricane recovery and/or resiliency measures only.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF SANIBEL, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. The recitals above are true and correct and made a part hereof.

SECTION 2. The application fee waiver for variances (Section 90-486, Code of Ordinances) sought in the recovery from Hurricanes Ian, Helene, and Milton, or for resiliency, is hereby approved by the City Council:

SECTION 3. This waiver shall expire on December 31, 2025 unless extended by City Council.

SECTION 4. This Resolution shall be effective immediately upon adoption.
