

The Fogarty Training Center was created in response to the need for in house, up-to-date, high-quality training. Training Center courses fulfill most of the training requirements of your MS4 permit. - ◆ **Communications and Information Sharing** – The FSA Stormwater Utilities Survey is conducted and distributed every two years. FSA's website contains previously published editions of the newsletter, a membership directory, communications tools, regulatory information, and an order form to purchase our manual on *Establishing Stormwater Utilities in Florida*.
- ◆ **Advocacy** – The Association is actively represented during the Legislative Session, in front of agencies, and in state and federal courts. We support legislation that is of benefit to stormwater utilities and local governments in the areas of stormwater management and finance. The Association monitors the activities of FDEP, EPA, and other state and federal regulatory initiatives, and challenges to stormwater utilities. 

Introduction

This Report presents the results of the Association's 15th biennial Stormwater Utilities Survey in Florida. Its purpose is to provide information to both managers and policy-makers in state and local government. Trends in the characteristics of the stormwater programs, utility rates and other practices within local governments can now be observed by comparing survey results through 2024.

Florida has 67 counties and over 400 cities. Short of surveying *every* local government, it is difficult to determine exactly how many stormwater utilities exist in the state. FSA's best estimate is that there are now approximately 171 local governments that have established stormwater utilities pursuant to Chapter 403, Florida Statutes or their own home rule powers. The 2024 survey questionnaire received 137 stormwater utility responses.

We expect the demand for stormwater utilities to continue for several reasons: The Florida Supreme Court has consistently upheld the validity of such fees; there is (generally) more public support for funding programs with user fees as opposed to ad valorem or other general taxes; and, the process of implementing Numeric Nutrient Criteria and the multi-billion dollar Water Quality Restoration Program in Florida continue to drive costs higher.

As one might assume, service areas dedicated exclusively to cities constitute a significant majority of stormwater utilities - in part reflecting the relative ease of attaching a user charge onto an existing billing mechanism. Most stormwater utilities are located within a department of public works and have used impervious area as the basis for calculating the fee.

As in earlier surveys, revenue generated from stormwater utilities represents a significant source of funds to address stormwater pollution and flooding problems. Most jurisdictions report that utility charges are adequate to meet most administrative costs but not for needs associated with capital improvement programs. Whether stormwater utility fees can be raised at a rate to keep pace with the costs of expanding state and federal water related requirements remains to be seen.

The Association appreciates the assistance of those who completed the survey instrument. We hope that you find this Report to be of value.






2-1 Within which Water Management District is your SWU located? (multiple responses accepted)



2-2 What is the basic methodology used for your revenue generation?




2-3 What is the general basis for your fee?








