## **PROCLAMATION**

WHEREAS: In 2015, the Florida Native Plant Society (FNPS) established the month of

October as Florida Native Plant Month. While many states have stunning displays of spring flowers, Florida's climate provides opportunities for the public to also appreciate the beauty of native plants in the fall; and

WHEREAS: Native plants serve as the foundation for wildlife habitat and improve

biodiversity by providing critical resources for pollinators, and other

species of native and migratory wildlife; and

WHEREAS: Native plants are specifically adapted to Florida's rainfall patterns and

soil conditions, and are more resistant to pests and diseases reducing the need for irrigation, fertilizers, and pesticides, and thus promoting

water conservation and water quality protection; and

WHEREAS: Native plants have been shown to effectively combat erosional forces

and strengthen coastal resiliency; and

WHEREAS: More than 3,000 species of native plants inhabit Florida, at least 256 of

which are "endemic" and do not occur anywhere else in the world; and

WHEREAS: Sanibel was recognized by Tree City USA for spending at least \$2 per

capita on its community forestry program and has been a participating

member for 34 years; and

WHEREAS: In 2022, Sanibel was recognized by the Florida Native Plant Society for

its utilization of native groundcovers, shrubs and trees in the City Hall landscaping design, as well as its commitment to educating the public

about the importance of native plants; and

WHEREAS: Sanibel instilled this commitment to Florida's native plants through the

creation and adoption of the Comprehensive Land Use Plan, which preserves the unique and natural characteristics of the Island through environmentally responsible development and the prohibition of

invasive exotic plant species; and

WHEREAS: Sanibel residents can show appreciation for Florida's native plants by

incorporating them into all landscaping projects and support initiatives that preserve, conserve, and restore native plants and plant

communities in our barrier island sanctuary.

NOW, THEREFORE, We, the City Council of the City of Sanibel, Lee County Florida, on behalf of the citizens of Sanibel, do hereby declare October 2023, as Florida Native Plant Month on Sanibel Island, and urge all citizens to celebrate the ecological, cultural, and economical benefits of native groundcovers, shrubs, and trees.
