This addendum is hereby incorporated into the bid documents of the project referenced above. The following items are clarifications, corrections, additions, deletions, and/or revisions to and shall take precedence over the original document.

**A. Questions and Answers**

Question No. 1: I reviewed the Bid documents and permits for the project listed above and saw that the permits left the determination of the dredge methodology up to the City. Why did the City limit this work to hydraulic dredging only? It seems you have a staging location close enough to the water that access could be found to complete this project mechanically. Would the city entertain bid submittals if the contractor's methodology is mechanical dredging?

Response No. 1: Condition #12 of the FDEP permit states: "The dredge material shall be hydraulically dredged and pumped into a geotextile dewatering tubes located at the approved upland disposal location at (No Named Address) Parcel ID #30-46-23-T2-U9622.2518. Sanibel, Florida 33957, in Section 2, Township 46 South, Range 21 East, in Lee County." The City cannot entertain bid submittals using mechanical dredging methodology.

Question No. 2: Also, How much of the identified Muck Dewatering area can be cleared for material storage? I'm not sure if that space is large enough to hold a 5,000+ CY hydraulic dredge operation. Dewatering and removing the material will take much longer than dredging it which means lots of downtime for the hydraulic dredge as it waits for haul out.

Response No. 2: No, the staging areas shown on the plans may not be expanded/cleared as they are on private property (via Right of Entry Agreements) that is not owned by the City. However, the Contractor may choose to approach one or more owners of adjacent vacant properties to request permission to utilize additional area for dewatering activities. Acceptability of this is subject to City receiving written approval from the property owner and is subject to approval by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection.

Question No. 3: Does the City have a disposal location that is a pass through cost to the contractor?

Response No. 3: No, the City does not have a disposal site. All material must be hauled off-island and disposed of at an approved site identified by the contractor. . It is the Contractor's responsibility to provide in writing a proposed offsite disposal location which is subject to approval by the Florida Department of Environmental Protection, per Permit Specific Condition No. 5.

Question No.4: Is there an estimated value (dollar amount) for the project? Possibly something that the company you contracted can provide?

Response No.4: The City has been awarded to grants to complete the project, and the remaining budget for construction is \$1,734,401.
