To whom it may concern,

Please let this letter serve as my full support for the City of Sanibel's (City) grant application titled "Community Park & Frannie's Preserve Trail Restoration Project" to the Hurricane Ian Recovery Grant Program which would fund the partial restoration and safety enhancements of the urban forested areas located along this public trail system.

Immediately after Hurricane Ian, City Council prioritized assistance for health and social services, infrastructure repairs and economic recovery. In the more than 24 months that has passed since the storm, council members and executive leadership are now directing staff to explore additional solutions for hazard mitigation and disaster resilience. Given Sanibel's geographic location as a barrier island, the City recognizes the urgency of incorporating urban forestry practices to withstand the impacts of future extreme weather events.

Many environmental services are contributed by mature trees in urban landscapes, including runoff reduction and nutrient removal for stormwater management, evapotranspiration and carbon sequestration for climate adaptation planning, and improved land connectivity to sustain biodiversity and habitat fragmentation for humans and wildlife species. The "Community Park & Frannie's Preserve Trail Restoration Project" was selected due to its history of being jointly maintained by the City and the Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation (SCCF). This longstanding partnership has demonstrated to be an effective distribution of resources for sustainable land use and land management, and we anticipate this project aligns well with the funding priorities listed in the Hurricane lan Recovery Grant Program.

Project Narrative:

The City of Sanibel is a barrier Island located off the coast of Southwest Florida. About two thirds of the total land area on Sanibel lies within conservation areas owned by private or governmental conservation agencies, and this unique environment has produced an abundance of natural resources. In addition to the multitude of passive recreation opportunities from its beaches and wetlands, the City has a good system of parks and recreation sites for hikers and non-motorized vehicles that do not adversely impact these preservation lands.

The Sanibel Community Park Trail was originally designed as a 0.58 mile loop trail to encourage visitors of Sanibel Community Park to explore the newly restored City-owned conservation lands. Following a meeting in 2012 with the Sanibel Captiva Conservation Foundation (SCCF) and the City's Natural Resources Department staff, the project was expanded to include a southern and central trail option through Frannie's Preserve which extended the trail by 0.67 miles with the option of one-way travel from Community Park to the Tarpon Bay shared use path (SUP). The new 1.34 mile trail which included a combination of City-owned and SCCF-owned lands allowed the general public to view a larger array of natural habitats, including tropical hardwood hammock, a dense canopied buttonwood forest, and views of the historic Sanibel River. Visitors to the park also have the opportunity to observe many wildlife species, including bobcats, river otters, raptors, songbirds, wading birds, turtles and alligators.




Figure 1. Sanibel Community Park/Frannie's Preserve Trail

The impacts of Hurricane Ian were far reaching across the island and impacted not only residential and commercial structures, but the island's public recreation spaces as well. Sanibel is fortunate to have had many native trees in the Community Park/Frannie's Preserve Trail that helped mitigate wind and storm surge damage. Due to staffing constraints and finite resources, City Council initially prioritized assistance for health and social services, infrastructure repairs and economic recovery. In the more than 24 months that has passed since the storm, council members and executive leadership are now directing staff to explore additional solutions for hazard mitigation and disaster resilience. Considering the damage from Hurricane Ian, the City, in continued partnership with SCCF, are seeking funding to restore and enhance the urban forested areas located along this public trail system (Fig. 1).

Sanibel's Natural Resource Department generated a list of horticulturally available plants to be considered for use for public, commercial and residential landscape enhancements. After Hurricane Ian, the department revisited the list and prepared an inventory of plant material that either weathered the storm with minimal disturbance or sustained initial damage but subsequently recovered. Their staff is assisted by the Vegetation Advisory Committee, a group of residential volunteers who provide education about the importance of native vegetation and regularly participate in community events to promote the incorporation of trees in landscaping. Part of these offerings also include leading guided tours of demonstration gardens and publishing articles that are available on the City's website.

The primary goal of the "Community Park & Frannie's Preserve Trail Restoration Project" is to revegetate the trails (Fig. 2, Fig. 3, and Fig. 4) with tree species that demonstrated resilience to high winds, heavy rain and storm surge, qualities that also helped to minimize flooding, protect surrounding infrastructure, and provide habitat for species of native and migratory wildlife. The other components to the restoration project are to perform corrective trimming of trees located the sections of the public trail system with a buttonwood canopy (Fig. 5) and to remove invasive exotic vegetation. Selective branch removal will help the remaining trees better withstand future storms by addressing specific structural issues, defects, or imbalances. Invasive exotic vegetation outcompetes native species for resources and alters their habitat structure. Addressing both issues would reduce the potential for hazards and pest proliferation and also provide a better foundation for wildlife biodiversity.

Many environmental services are contributed by mature trees in urban landscapes, including runoff reduction and nutrient removal for stormwater management, evapotranspiration and carbon sequestration for climate adaptation planning, and improved land connectivity to sustain biodiversity and habitat fragmentation for humans and wildlife species. Due to the low maintenance requirements after establishment, only trees native to Southwest Florida and adapted to barrier island habitats were selected for the planting component of the project. To ensure the survivability of these grant funded trees, the City will add the restoration areas to the normal scope in its land management contracted services.

Tree Planting – Trees will be locally sourced and protected during transportation and delivery and prior to installation. Planting sites will be identified by City staff and determined based on adequate rooting space, proximity from other trees, trails, and other infrastructure. Species determination and planting schedule will be provided to contractors ahead of installation and they will be inspected by City staff during and after installation.

Initial Tree Maintenance – City staff will inspect every tree after installation to be sure that planting locations and maintenance methods are adhered to. Soil type and weather conditions influence the demand for water, so initial irrigation frequency and timing will depend on seasonal rainfall and site conditions at the time of installation.

Tree Trimming – All tree trimming along the trail will be supervised by a certified arborist who is employed by SCCF. In addition to adhering to ISA guidelines, the activities will also incorporate USDA Forest Service best management practices, including the removal of no more than 25% of the living crown, the maintenance of live branches, the establishment of a strong primary branch structure, and avoidance of cuts located between branches.

Invasive Exotic Vegetation Removal - Work will include the basal bark treatment of exotic vegetation including Brazilian pepper in both easily accessible and difficult to access trail -less wooded areas often requiring strenuous labor in dense vegetation. The crew is fully equipped capable of performing the following tasks: herbicide treatment of exotic and/ or invasive trees, saplings and seedlings with hand-held and/ or backpack sprayers, cut and chip vegetation removal using a chipper, hand -clearing with chainsaw and machete, mowing using hand propelled brush mowers.

- 8. Nothing contained in the foregoing shall be construed to require establishment of a system of records in order to render in good faith the certification required by this clause. The knowledge and information of a participant is not required to exceed that which is normally possessed by a prudent person in the ordinary course of business dealings.
