Dear Colonel Booth,

On behalf of the Sanibel City Council and the citizens of Sanibel, thank you for your commitment to the equitable distribution of freshwater releases from Lake Okeechobee. As our community is still in the early stages of our recovery from the devastating impacts of Hurricane Ian and red tide persists in our coastal waters, the Corps' decision announced last Friday to maintain flows to the Caloosahatchee in the optimal RECOVER range is a welcome one. While we fully appreciate that the continued high water in the Lake is harmful to the ecology of Lake Okeechobee and increases our risk of high-volume releases during the wet season, we thank you for sparing the Caloosahatchee from damaging releases.

We continue to urge the Corps to utilize every outlet available to minimize harm to the northern estuaries and lower lake levels prior to the upcoming rainy season by maintaining optimal flows to the estuaries, maximizing the volume of water sent south, and full utilization of dispersed water management projects and other structures south of the lake. In addition to these short-term strategies, we encourage continued momentum to complete projects that will provide much needed storage north, south, east, & west of Lake Okeechobee.

We know that balancing the needs of all stakeholders is a tremendously complex task. We thank you for your continued dedication to manage Lake Okeechobee in a science-based manner that aims to protect the citizens, economy, and ecology of south Florida and we look forward to our continued collaboration and partnership.
